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### 4. Code of Conduct for Students

At the time of admission, every student would have to sign a statement that they agree to follow the outlined codes and also confirm their commitments that:


- Students are expected to maintain the highest discipline standards and dignified behavior on campus of the college.
- Any physical or verbal discrimination based on a person's gender identity, caste, race, religion or religious beliefs, color, region, language, disability, marital or family status, physical or mental disability, etc.
- Indulging ragging, anti-institutional, anti-national, antisocial, communal, immoral or political expressions and activities within the Campus and hostel are strongly prohibited as well as punishable.
- Punishment would be applicable for damage to or destruction of the College's or any other property on the site. A committee will be present to investigate any potential violation of the aforementioned codes of conduct by a student.
- Every student is obliged to keep the classrooms, laboratories, and campus generally clean.
- Every student is required to carry his or her identity card when on the college premises.
- The student must attend classes regularly and finish all of his or her coursework at the College.
- It is definitely forbidden to engage in any activity that hinders the college's administrative, teaching, or research activities.
- It is completely forbidden to smoke, chew tobacco, or consume any other intoxicating substances.
- Inside the college, playing cards, spitting, and loitering are completely forbidden and will result in harsh punishment/disciplinary action.s
- Cell phone use is categorically forbidden during class time.





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
- On or off campus, theft attempts or actual thefts of, damages to, or destruction of College property, community member property, or other private or public property will be punished.

- Students are required to check the Notice Board and also website of the college for important announcements.









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
- 5. Code of Conduct for Teachers, governing body and administration including Director/Principal/Officials and Support Staff Academic Administrators and Teachers have a major role to play in building the nation and a community that values education. Teachers, governing body and administration including Director/Principal/Officials and Support Staff should:
- Retain active membership in professional organizations and work to improve education and profession through them.
- Perform their duties in the form of teaching, tutorials, practical's, seminars, and research work with diligence and dedication;
- Respect the student's right and dignity to express their opinions;
- Participate in professional meetings, seminars, conferences, etc. to contribute knowledge; and Express free and frank opinions.
- Cooperate and assist in carrying out the functions related to the educational responsibilities of the college such as: assisting in appraising admissions applications, advising and counselling students; discourage and not engage in plagiarism and other unethical behavior in teaching and research;
- Abide by the Act, Statute and Ordinance of the University and to respect its ideals, vision, mission, cultural practices and tradition.
- Treat all students fairly and impartially without regard to their race, religion, caste, or other social, economic, or physical features; acknowledge that each student has a unique aptitude and capability, and work to satisfy their needs;
- Assist students in developing an understanding of our national heritage and national goals.
- Encourage students to improve their academic performance, develop their personalities, and, at the same time, contribute to the welfare of the community.





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- Pay attention to only the student's achievement in the assessment of merit; Make themselves available to the students even after class hours and help and guide students without any remuneration or reward.
- Treat other members of the profession in the same way they would like to be treated: Speak respectfully of other teachers and offer assistance for their professional development, refrain from bringing unfounded complaints against coworkers to higher authorities.
- Teachers should participate in the joint staff councils that serve the needs of the teaching and non-teaching personnel.
- Make an effort to ensure that institutions stay in touch with parents of their students, send performance reports to parents as needed, and meet with parents at meetings called for the purpose of brainstorming and for the institution's benefit. This can be done through teacher bodies and organizations.
- Acknowledge that education is a public good and work to inform the public about the educational initiatives being offered;
- Perform the responsibilities of citizenship, participate in community activities, and carry out the duties of public offices;
- Work to improve education in the community and strengthen the community's moral and intellectual life;
- Be aware of social problems and take part in activities that would be conducive to the progress of society and, therefore, the country as a whole;
- Provide inspirational and motivational value-based academic and executive leadership to the college through policy formation, operational management, optimization of human resources and concern for environment and sustainability;
- To communicate with all departments and organizations about academic and administrative issues while bringing them to the attention of the director, and trust office.





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- To send regular reports to the Director about the college's finances, academics, and other related issues via the Trust office and the honorary Secretary.
- Encourage the college's collaborative, cooperative, and consultative workplace culture, which will open doors for creative thinking and ideas:
- Make an effort to advance a workplace culture and principles that foster professionalism, quality, job satisfaction, and service to the community.








1. **Induction Program:** Undergraduate and graduate students are inducted into the program each year in July at the beginning of the academic year. Academics are taught during induction program.



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


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
